<u>GREEN TIP:</u> Ensure refrigerants are wisely recycled. Refrigerants in air conditioners and refrigerators, thanks to worldwide environmental action decades ago, allow the ozone hole to close making sunlight less likely to cause skin cancer. But, unless the refrigerant is carefully removed from recycled appliances before the system is cut open, the amount of heat trapped in the atmosphere increases an incredible amount. How incredible? When a car loses all its air conditioning refrigerant (about 1.5 pounds), the effect on global warming is about the same as burning 6000 pounds (3 tons) of coal or 700 gallons of gasoline.
